Climate Change Youth Leaders

The Malawi Scotland Partnership (MaSP) and 2050 Climate Group in Scotland are implementing a project on youth engagement in climate action called **Malawi's Youth Leaders Climate Change Project**. The main aim of the project is to engage with young people and provide them with the skills to raise awareness on the impacts of climate change among young people, and their communities. This will ignite individual and group action against climate change.

The project is recruiting 15 young people to be engaged as **Climate Change Youth Leaders**. The Youth Leaders will undergo training and be challenged to propel a movement on climate change issues within their communities and beyond. They will also be linked to the National Youth Network on Climate Change and will be co-supervised by MaSP and the National Youth Council of Malawi.

Please note that this is a voluntary role.

DO YOU HAVE WHAT IT TAKES?

1. Are you aged between 15 and 35?
2. Are you passionate about the environment, do you understand the challenges around climate change and do you want to be involved in a climate action project?
3. Have you ever launched, contributed to, or taken the lead in climate change initiatives or can you show a great involvement in climate change or environmental sustainability in another way?
4. Are you ready to undergo an intensive transformation and leadership journey in climate action?

5. Are you excited about shaping a long-term plan on tackling climate change? Would you benefit from developing the leadership skills and moral imagination to make it happen?

Climate Change Young Leaders:

1. Come from diverse cultural, geographic and socioeconomic backgrounds
2. Are passionate about tackling climate change issues in their community through their work or personal life
3. Can be working as an individual or part of a team/organization
4. Are able to articulate issues eloquently and have functional spoken and written competency in the English language
5. Must be individuals who can show a clear commitment and drive for involvement in this climate action project even though they might not currently be engaged in any climate change initiatives.
6. Girls, women and people from rural areas are strongly encouraged to apply.
